After a vigorous restoration process, the Bell was dedicated on July 30, 2025, in the Outdoor Therapeutic Center at the Flat Rock Homes Main Campus. The Hopkins's joined residents, Board members, staff, and guests for the ceremony and reception, celebrating Flat Rock's 159-year history.
